## **Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes**

An aim of economics is to study the interaction of individuals' decisions and how markets solve the problems of resource allocation. This course uses economics to study certain pressing problems that society faces today.

Topics include pollution, global warming, economic growth, inflation, unemployment, poverty, economic fluctuations and the role of government in stabilizing the economy. In the process of studying these problems, students get some exposure to economics and at the same time, come to understand society more deeply.

On completion of this course, students should be able to understand basic concepts used in economics, know how the market works, apply economics to study environmental problems, understand the economic nature of social problems.
