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4. Course Requirements

4.1 Attendance and Participation

Each student must attend all final presentations. You are encouraged to participate actively in class discussion.

4.2 Final Presentation

Each presentation will be about 15 minutes in length, followed by a 5-minute discussion and Q&A.

4.3 Final Paper

The final paper should be between 12 and 20 pages in length (excluding tables, figures, and references). To ensure consistency, the main text of the paper should comply with the following format:

Font: Times New Roman
Font size: 12 point
Margin: 1 inch all around
Spacing: Opt before, Opt after, double line spacing

Students are required to submit a softcopy via VeriGuide of their paper to the instructor. The deadline for submitting the paper is **December 8, 2017**. Late submission will have 20% of the mark deducted per 24 hour period or portion of a 24-hour period that it is late. A paper submitted more than 4 days (96 hours) after the due time will receive a zero mark.
