Course Description: The course consists of two components. The first component contains several workshops that focus on essential skills in research, report writing and presentation. In the second part of the course, students are required to search and discuss articles on current economic problems under the intensive guidance of the instructor. Students are expected not only to gain basic knowledge in the design of an appropriate research project in economics but also to improve their public speaking and overall writing abilities.

Method of Evaluation:

Part I (STOT workshops, 20%): Attendance (3%), Workshop Assignments (17%)

Part II (Research project, 80%): Participation (15%), Class Presentation (15%), Poster Presentation (20%), Final Report (30%)

Participation: Participation will be graded based on attendance and contribution to the class and group consultation sessions. Workshop and lecture attendances are mandatory. Please notify me in advance or give me a note afterward for any medical emergency, religious holiday, field trip and athletic contest, which are the only valid excuses for an absence.

In addition, courtesy is expected in classroom. In particular, you should refrain from chitchatting, making loud noises, or playing with electronic devices during lectures. You can also lose participation points if your behavior becomes disruptive to the class.

Group Project: You will form groups of 4 students for a research project. Group formation will be done before the third week of class.

The final paper should have no more than 15 pages (excluding graphs and tables), and should be double-spaced with font size 12. All references (including your textbooks and web references) you have used and cited in the paper should be included. To list your references, you are required to follow one of the styles: MLA, APA, Chicago or American Economic Review or Journal of Economic Literature.
