ECON 4901F (2018 Fall Thur 0830-1015) Guided Studies in Current Economic Problems II Travis Ng

ECON 4901 has two parts. Part I consists of the two workshops on research methods and data analysis. Part II consists of interactive consultations, classroom discussion, presentation, and write-up of the research projects. English is our language for teaching, discussions and presentation. The course aims at helping students improve their presentation and writing skills through working on a research project of their choice.

I. STOT Workshops [weeks 2,3](20%)

- (i) **Attendance [4 marks]:** the STOT workshops in weeks 2 and 3.
- (ii) **Assignment [16 marks]:** the STOT-workshops assignments.

II. Research Project [weeks 4-13](80%)

- (iii) **Interactive consultation [15 marks]**: 7 sessions from 0840-1005. Everyone must come and actively engage in the interactions.
- (iv) **Presentation [25 marks]**: We will fix the order of the presentations in the first class. Each presentation will last for about 20 minutes. The Q&A happens during the presentations. Everyone must attend all the presentations and interact actively with other presenters during her own and others' presentations.
- (v) **Write-up [40 marks]**: The shorter the better. The deadline for the final paper is at 1700 on Dec, 19 2018 (Wednesday). Students are required to submit both a hardcopy and a softcopy (via VeriGuide). Late submission gets zero mark.
