Course Description

This course provides a conceptual framework that helps us understand China's growth over the three decades since the late 1970s and its recent slowdown. We will: (i) explore the politico-economic arrangements that have been underpinning China's high growth; (ii) discuss the institutional changes that may be responsible for the recent slowdown; (3) evaluate welfare implications of the rise of Chinese economy in a global perspective; (4) discuss timely topics including the rise of the service sector, the adjustment of external imbalances, the efficiency of R&D investment and the transformation of the financial sector.

Topic 5: Extension of the Baseline Framework: Recent Institutional Changes and Economic Slowdown

Topic 6: Domestic Structural Issues (barriers to rural-urban migration, population ageing, underdeveloped service sector, allocative inefficiency of R&D investment ...)

Topic 7: External Imbalances (the nature of trade imbalances and their recent correction, macro consequences of capital account liberalization and capital controls ...)

Topic 8: Banking and Finance (the nature of local financing vehicles, the rise of shadow banking, welfare consequences of China's partial financial liberalization ...)
