## **Course Description**

This course mainly explores the way contemporary economists analyze current social problems/issues. Students will be exposed to the fundamental theories and principles of the economic science. These theories and principles will then be used to analyze and understand contemporary economic issues. No prior knowledge of economics is assumed. Intuitive reasoning is used throughout, with little involvement of mathematics.

This course is designed for elective students who are not majoring or minoring in economics.

- 1) Understand intuitively the basic principles and concepts of economics.
- 2) Be able to use the economics perspective to understand current affairs.
- 3) Be able to apply economic logic to analyzing contemporary economic issues.
