ECON 4901 (2021 Fall Fri 0930-1115) Guided Studies in Current Economic Problems II Travis Ng

Part I consists of 2 workshops on research methodology and data analysis. Part II consists of interactive consultations, classroom discussion, presentation, and write-up of the research projects. English is our language for teaching, discussions and presentation. The course aims at helping students improve their presentation and writing skills through working on a research project of their choice.

Part I: STOT Workshops on week 2 and week 3 (20%)

- (i) Attendance [4 marks]: the STOT workshops in weeks 2 and 3.
- (ii) **Assignment [16 marks]:** the STOT-workshops assignments.

Part II: Research Project on week 1, weeks 5-13 (80%)

- (iii) Attendance and class participation [15 marks]: Oct 8 is Interactive group consultation and is mandatory. Everyone must come and actively engage in the interactions. Nov 26 and Dec 3 are mandatory as well. You need to show up to present your work and actively discuss your classmates' works. It is a huge disrespect to other students if you show up late. I'll deduct your marks if you do. I'll ask you to grade the other students' presentations. During weeks 6-11, set up a one-on-one consultation with me at least twice at our classroom. You need to prepare the meeting well.
- (iv) **Presentation [25 marks]:** We will randomize the order of the presentations. No one knows who goes first. Each presentation will last for about 20 minutes. The Q&A happens during the presentations. Everyone must attend all the presentations and interact actively with other presenters during her own and others' presentations.
- (v) Write-up [40 marks]: The shorter the better. The deadline for the final paper is at 1700 on Dec, 17 2018 (Friday). Students are required to submit both a hardcopy and a softcopy (via VeriGuide). Late submission gets zero mark.
