1 Course Description and Objectives

This course involves group consultations, classroom discussions and presentation of research projects. Students are expected not only to gain basic knowledge in the design of an appropriate research project but also to improve their public speaking and overall writing abilities. After taking this course, students should be able to carry out and present the findings of their own research project.

3 Course Requirements

- 1. Group: Form groups of 1-2 people for a research project. Send me the list of your group member before Jan 31st. Otherwise, I will randomly assign you to a group.
- 2. Consultation: Each consultation session will be **15 minutes** and can be signed up via the Google sheet here: Sign Up. You should sign up for consultation sessions **before 5pm the day before the consultation**. You are suggested to bring a write-up of ideas, methodology, data, or results when you come to the consultation. Each group must attend a minimum of two consultation sessions, but is limited to a maximum of four consultation sessions.
- 3. Presentation: Sign up your presentation via the same Google sheet as above: Sign Up (first come first serve). Each presentation will be no more than **15 minutes** in length, followed by a 5-minute discussion and Q&A. Each student must attend all final presentations.
- 4. Poster presentation: The poster session will be held at ELB lobby, LT1, LT2, LT3, and LT4 on 25 April 2022 (tentative). We will invite high school students to come and you can present your work in front of them. If not feasible, you can still upload a video on our department website.
- 5. Final report: The final report should be between **12 and 20 pages** in length (excluding tables, figures, and references). The report needs to contain introduction, literature review, methodology, results, and conclusion. To ensure consistency in the format, the main text of the paper should comply with the following format

Font: Times New Roman

Font size: 12 point

Margin: 1 inch all around

Spacing: 0pt before, 0pt after, double line spacing

The deadline for the final paper is **5pm on 20 May 2022 (Friday)**. Students are required to submit both hardcopy and softcopy (via VeriGuide) of their paper to the instructor. Late submission will receive a zero mark.
