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**Course Description & Objective**

This course involves group consultations, classroom discussions, presentation of research projects, and designing of a poster for presenting their final findings in front of the public. Students are expected not only to gain basic knowledge in the design of an appropriate research project but also to improve their public speaking and overall writing abilities.

**Group Formation**

Students are to form groups of 2 people. Individual project or group of 3 people may be allowed with special reasons.

**Consultation**

Each group is expected to meet the instructor for consultation. Each consultation session is 15 minutes. There will be timeslots for signing up in Blackboard later. The consultation intends to provide guidance on ideas, methodology, and data for your group project.

**Presentation**

Each group is to present in-class for 15 minutes and will be followed by a 5-min discussion.

**Poster Presentation**

Tentatively, the poster presentation date is on 25 April 2022 (i.e., makeup class day) to be held at ELB lobby, LT1, LT2, LT3 and LT4. All groups are required to design a poster and be able to present in front of live audience.
