## ECON 4901A Guided Studies in Current Economic Problems II First Term, 2022-2023

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## 1 Course Description and Objectives

The course aims to introduce the basic skills of conducting economic research and developing a student's ability on the analysis of economic problems. ECON 4901 is divided into two parts. The first part contains two workshops that focus on research methodology and use of economic data. The second part involves lectures (conducted in English), classroom discussion, and presentation of research projects. With this format, students are expected not only to gain basic knowledge in the design of an appropriate research project but also to improve their public speaking and overall writing abilities.

## 4 Course Requirements

#### 4.1 STOT Workshops (20%)

- 1. To encourage students to attend the STOT workshops, attendance and participation is counted as a part of the course assessment. A total of 4 marks are assigned to the student's attendance and participation.
- 2. To encourage students to better understand the materials covered in the STOT workshops, assignments are given and graded. A total of 16 marks are allocated to the STOT-workshops assignments

### 4.2 Research Project (80%)

1. Consultation: Each consultation session will be **15 minutes** and can be signed up at the Google sheet.

Students should sign up for consultation sessions **before 5pm the day before the consultation**. Students are suggested to bring a write-up of ideas, methodology and data to see the instructor. Each student must attend a minimum of two consultation sessions, but is limited to a maximum of four consultation sessions. A total of 10 marks are allocated to the consultation participation.

- 2. Presentation: Sign up your presentation in the same google sheet above. Each presentation will be no more than **15 minutes** in length, followed by a 5-minute discussion and Q&A. Each student must attend all final presentations. A total of 5 marks are allocated to the presentation participation and a total of 25 marks are allocated to the presentation.
- 3. Final paper: The final paper should be between **12 and 20 pages** in length (excluding tables, figures, and references). To ensure consistency in the format, the main text of the paper should comply with the following format

Font: Times New Roman

Font size: 12 point

Margin: 1 inch all around

Spacing: Opt before, Opt after, double line spacing

The deadline for the final paper is **5pm on 23 December 2020 (Friday)**. Students are required to submit a softcopy (via VeriGuide) of their paper to the instructor. Late submission will receive a zero mark. A total of 40 marks are allocated to the paper.
