ECON 4901C: Guided Studies in Current Economic Problems II

1. Course Description and Objectives

ECON 4901 is divided into two parts. The first part contains two workshops that focus on research methodology and use of economic data. The second part involves lectures (conducted in English), classroom discussion, and presentation of research projects. With this format, students are expected not only to gain basic knowledge in the design of an appropriate research project but also to improve their public speaking and overall writing abilities.

4. Course Requirements

4.1. STOT Workshops (20%)

- 1. To encourage students to attend the STOT workshops, attendance and participation is counted as a part of the course assessment. A total of 4 marks are assigned to the students attendance and participation.
- 2. To encourage students to better understand the materials covered in the STOT workshops, assignments are given and graded. A total of 16 marks are allocated to the STOT-workshops assignments

4.2. Research Projects (80%)

- 1. Consultation: Each consultation session will be 20 minutes and the schedules are posted in the Groups at the Blackboard system. Students should sign up for consultation sessions before 5pm the day before the consultation. Students are suggested to bring a write-up of ideas, methodology and data to see the instructor. Each student must attend a minimum of three consultation sessions, but is limited to a maximum of four consultation sessions. A total of 5 marks are allocated to the consultation participation.
- 2. Presentation: The order of the presentation will be determined in the randomly. Each presentation will be no more than 15-20 minutes in length, followed by a 5-minute discussion and Q&A. Each student must attend all final presentations. A total of 10 marks are allocated to the presentation participation and a total of 25 marks are allocated to the presentation.
- 3. Final paper: The final paper should be between 12 and 20 pages in length (excluding tables, figures, and references). To ensure consistency in the format, the main text of the paper should comply with the following format
 - Font: Times New Roman

• Font size: 12 point

• Margin: 1 inch all around

• Spacing: 0pt before, 0pt after, double line spacing

The deadline for the final paper is 5 pm on 16 December 2022 (Friday). Students are required to submit both hardcopy (to the instructor's assignment box located on the 9th floor of the ELB) and softcopy (via VeriGuide) of their papers to the instructor. Late submission will receive a zero mark. A total of 40 marks are allocated to the paper.

Special Arrangement: In case it is impossible to submit the hardcopy of your papers, send a soft copy of your paper to me through email. The same deadline applies here.
