# **ECON 4901**

## **Guided Studies in Current Economic Problems II**

### **Course Outline**

ECON 4901 is divided into two parts. The first part contains two workshops that focus on research methodology and use of economic data. The second part involves lectures (conducted in English), classroom discussion, and presentation of research projects. With this format, students are expected not only to gain basic knowledge in the design of an appropriate research project but also to improve their public speaking and overall writing abilities.

## Part 1: STOT Workshops (20%)

- (i) To encourage students to attend the STOT workshops, attendance and participation is counted as a part of the course assessment. A total of 4 marks are assigned to the student's attendance and participation.
- (ii) To encourage students to better understand the materials covered in the STOT workshops, assignments are given and graded. A total of 16 marks are allocated to the STOT-workshops assignments

In order to refresh their research skills, 2 compulsory workshops will be held in the second and third week of class. Tentative schedule follows:

All STOT sections adhere to this same course assessment scheme. The range of grade distributions for the students' performance in each section is required to have reasonable variations. Moreover, the grade distribution should be in line with the guidelines set forth by the Registration and Examination Section.
